"Walk-in flu vaccines available daily."

Everyone 6 months and older should get the flu vaccine each year. Vaccination is especially important for people who are at high risk for complications from flu, and for people who live with or care for someone who is at high risk. Getting a flu vaccine is the single best way to protect yourself and your family from this serious disease.

Flu viruses are constantly changing, and different flu viruses circulate and cause illness each season. The annual flu vaccine is targeted to protect against the flu viruses research indicates will be most common that year.

The Health Department will be administering the following:

- The Trivalent Flu Vaccine has been standardized according to U.S. Public Health Service (USPHS) requirements for the 2024-2025 influenza season and is formulated to protect against two influenza A strains and one influenza B strain.
- The annual higher-dose influenza (flu) vaccinations have been proven to help protect from the same three strains and shown to better protect from serious complications of flu such as pneumonia and cardiac events when compared to standard dose vaccines in those 65 years and up.
